About us

LWF has been responding to the priorities and needs of conflict-affected populations in Iraq since 2014. With the transition from the humanitarian system in 2022, LWF Iraq is strengthening holistic programming integrating a rights-based approach. The program is expanding its areas of operation, especially in Gol through local partners, in order to support returnees and host communities to rebuild their lives, while continuing to support Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in Iraqi Kurdistan.



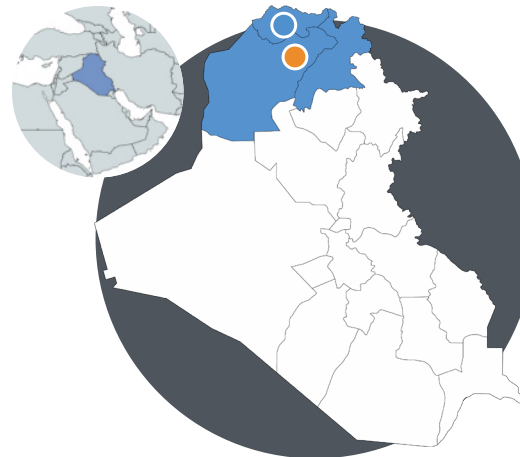

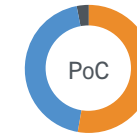

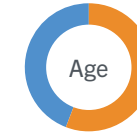

Who we work with

In 2022, LWF Iraq supported more than **96,000** Persons of Concern (PoC).



- 51,000 IDPs (53%)
- 42,000 local population (44%)
- 3,000 refugees (3%)



- 50,000 adults (52%)
- 46,000 children (48%)



- 48,000 women and girls (50%)
- 48,000 men and boys (50%)

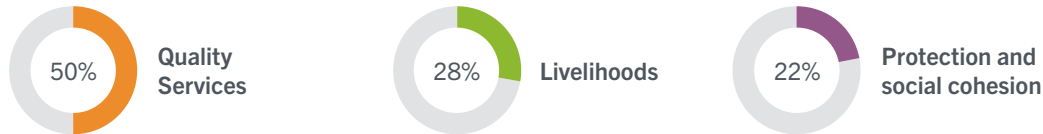

Bekas Islam Ramadhan, the owner of Rabeen Factory (a dairy production business), received a small loan from LWF Iraq to revive and expand his business. He increased his number of employees from six to ten and diversified his product line.

Our impact

LWF Iraq focuses on three programmatic area: Livelihoods, Quality Services, and Protection and Social Cohesion. The humanitarian-development-peace nexus approach is strengthened by mainstreaming Social Cohesion across interventions and addressing discrimination and exclusion through a rights-based approach. For 2022, Iraq invested 2.2 million Euros in programming. Expenditure and its impact are as follows:



QUALITY SERVICES

85% of community members report gaining access to sufficient drinking water
14,148 individuals received services in solid waste disposal and management



LIVELIHOODS

98% of participants in financial training report gaining relevant financial skills
30 individuals reported that they have more income following an LWF intervention



PROTECTION & SOCIAL COHESION

243 individuals accessed psychosocial support services
90% of participants to psychosocial support activities report an improved well-being
