

About us

LWF Jerusalem started in 1948 as a refugee and continues. 75 operation years later, to serve 5 million Palestinians. LWF Jerusalem owns and operates the Augusta Victoria Hospital (AVH) in East Jerusalem. It is the only hospital in the West Bank and Gaza with radiation therapy for cancer patients and medical facility in the West Bank offering pediatric kidney dialysis. AVH provides home-based palliative care and runs two mobile clinics in the West Bank for diabetes care and early breast cancer detection. LWF also operates a Vocational Training Programme, with two Centers in Jerusalem and Ramallah, empowering young Palestinian by enabling access to technical and life skills and market employment. LWF partners with six institutions to promote and provide Gender Responsive and Inclusive Technical and Vocational Education and Training.





United States President's Joe Biden highlighted the importance of AVH as a leading example of Palestinian excellence and civil engagement during his historical visit in July 2022. He announced a USD 100 million multi-year commitment toward the East Jerusalem Hospital Network of which AVH is a member.

Our impact

LWF Jerusalem's work relies on the three strategic areas of intervention: Livelihoods, Quality Services, Protection and Social Cohesion. Additionally, the country program focuses on Gender Justice and green energy as particular areas where we want to increase our impact. Our approach is rights-based and inclusive. For 2022, LWF Jerusalem invested 68.6 million euros in programming. Expenditure and its impact are as follow:







QUALITY SERVICES

7,810 patients were treated in AVH, including 6,232 patients from the West Bank and 1,568 from Gaza

11,821 unique individuals benefitted from the two mobile clinics of the community outreach program



LIVELIHOODS

963 trainees attended the Vocational Training Program (VTP).

82% of the VTP graduates have secured employment.



PROTECTION & SOCIAL COHESION

936 VTP trainees received counselling. and participated in assertiveness and empowerment sessions on their rights. 15,620 AVH patients and their relatives received psychosocial counseling and support.

Salim is a seven-year-old from Gaza suffering from Nasopharyngeal rhabdomyosarcoma, a soft-tissue tumor affecting children. Salim was transferred to AVH for his treatment and joined the school within the hospital to continue his education. He actively participated in the hospital's activities and events, showcasing his singing skills. He found comfort in the support he received from the hospital staff and other patients he met during his treatment. Despite the physical and emotional toll of the treatments, Salim never lost hope. He dreams of a day when he would be able to return home, play by the sea, and become a swimming coach.
