## About us

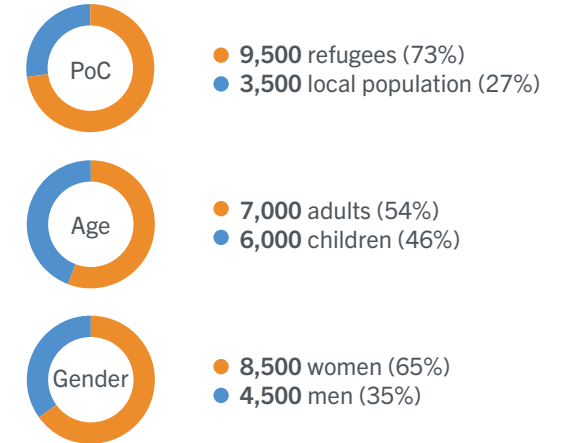

In 2022, LWF Jordan supported more than **13,000** Persons of Concern (PoC)

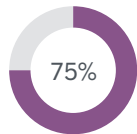

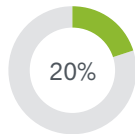

# Our impact

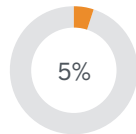
Over the last decade, LWF Jordan has increased the protection and safety of the most vulnerable and made continuous investments in professionalising the protection work, while supporting a variety of livelihoods activities as well as improved learning environments in more than 100 schools across Jordan. The income over this period equals EUR 28 Mio. For 2022, the investments and results per programmatic area are as follows:

## PROTECTION & SOCIAL COHESION

2,504 individuals accessed recreational and educational PSS activities  
91% of participants in protection activities reported improved well-being



## LIVELIHOODS

236 individuals completed technical livelihoods and employability skills training  
32 youths were trained to promote and advocate for worker's economic rights in Jordan



## QUALITY SERVICES

1,102 individuals were supported through the Covid-19 project  
90 people, survivors of GBV, were supported with cash assistance

“My family and I are from Homs and we had limited experience with animal husbandry. My mother-in-law and I took part in the programme proposed by LWF. In addition to practical training and advice, we received a total of four goats. They have now multiplied to 10. We are a big family, but we do not have to buy dairy products anymore. We produce our own cheese, butter, and yoghurt. In the future, we plan to set up a small business and sell our products for additional income.”
