

## Mazakpwe Gloria

The desperate fight for survival in refugee settlements often comes at a cost to the environment. With limited resources, displaced communities rely heavily on firewood for cooking, leading to deforestation and a vicious cycle of environmental degradation. But a simple solution is helping to break this cycle – the Lorena Stove. This simple, efficient stove uses less fuel than traditional methods, reducing the need to cut down trees and improving air quality. "Since we received training on how to construct Lorena stoves. we've noticed a significant reduction in firewood use," says Gloria, "It's making a big difference." The cleaner burning process also cuts down on harmful smoke, creating healthier homes. "Children are no longer getting burnt due to open fire," Gloria added. The Lorena Stove empowers communities to take charge of their environment and build a brighter future.
