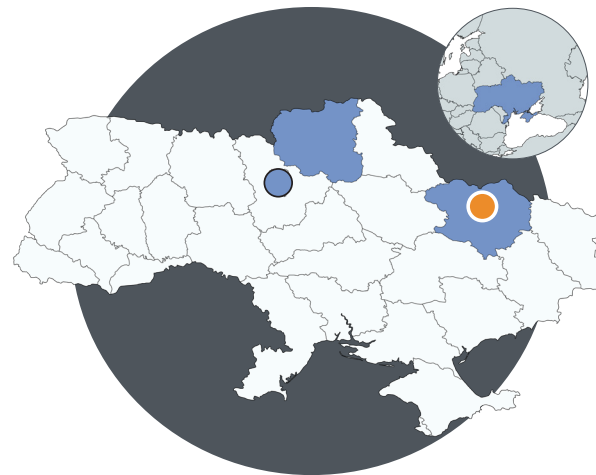
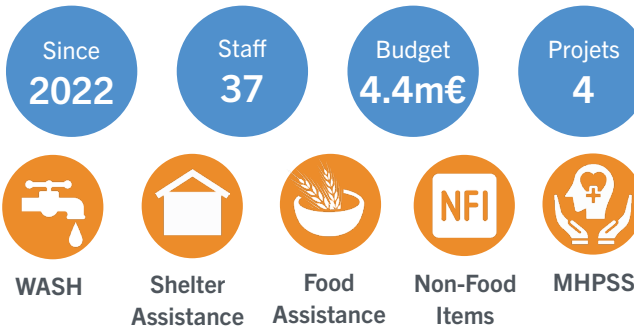

About us

The LWF Ukraine operates in a difficult context to provide conflict-affected population with humanitarian assistance. LWF Ukraine's sectors of intervention include shelter, non-food items (NFI), food distribution and mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS). To foster the sustainability and impact of its interventions, the program collaborates with local NGOs.



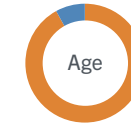

Who we work with

In 2023, LWF Ukraine supported **46,107** people.



- 10,497 IDPs (23%)
- 35, 610 Local/Host population (77%)



- 42,324 Adult (92%)
- 3,783 Children (8%)



- 24,859 Female (54%)
- 21,248 Male (46%)



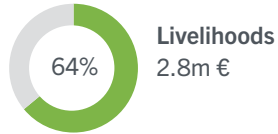

Our impact

The three programmatic areas of livelihoods, quality services, and protection and social cohesion are the foundation of LWF Ukraine's work. Working in particularly affected areas, the Ukraine country program specialized in shelters rehabilitation. In 2023, the program invested 4.3 million euros in operations, focusing mainly on humanitarian support..



QUALITY SERVICES

- 1,431 individuals have access to safe housing after receiving shelter assistance
- 4,175 individuals were provided with personal hygiene kits
- 359 individuals received diapers and urological pads
- 19,306 individuals received food assistance including food kits, food vouchers and hot meals.
- 20 households (89 elderly people) were supported with firewood for the winter season
- 720 individuals were provided with bedlinens in collective centers
- 363 elderly people received medical devises and vouchers for medicines
- 12,647 individuals had access to drinking water
- 5,890 individuals received NFI, including clothes, household appliances and power banks in collective centres and individual housing.



PROTECTION & SOCIAL COHESION

- 746 children received Mental Health and Psychosocial Support in emergency
- 279 adults participated in training sessions on community-based psychosocial support and other MHPSS activities.
- 51 individuals received protection assistance (document retrieval assistance)

“Artem and I return to our home, where he plays with his toys, sleeps in his warm bed, and attends physiotherapy. I realise that everything is possible, because LWF Ukraine has given us the belief that miracles do happen. I hope that all this will go for the best for my son and he will be able to personally thank the LWF team”.

Olesia is a 45 y.o single mother, raising a child with a disability. Her son Artem attended a specialised school for children with disabilities, as he was diagnosed with severe autism. In February 2022, after a missile strike in the neighborhood, Olesia's home was damaged and Artem's school closed.
