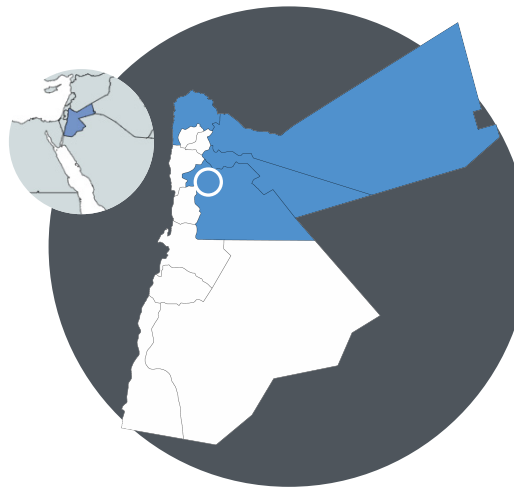

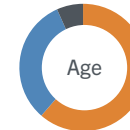

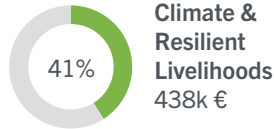
A young woman with an arts diploma turned her passion for farming into “Green Hydroponic Farm” (Green Hydroponic Farm), starting with a rented plastic greenhouse; she later expanded her work by utilizing her rooftop for growing medicinal plants and natural drying methods.

Through her participation in the entrepreneurship program supported by LWF Jordan, she developed essential skills in budgeting, marketing, and risk assessment. She grew from an aspiring farmer into an inspiring mentor, eager to empower others in her community.

Our impact

LWF Jordan focuses on Livelihoods, Protection & Social Cohesion, and Quality Services, guided by cross-cutting themes of disability inclusion, gender justice, and climate justice. These priorities, rooted in the LWF Global Strategy 2019-2024, shape all interventions to strengthen resilience, uphold rights, and promote equitable opportunities for vulnerable communities.



CLIMATE & RESILIENT LIVELIHOODS

329 individuals received handicraft training to support climate-resilient livelihoods.

2,843 individuals received clothing through Darzat Aman Boutique Clothes to strengthen community resilience.



QUALITY SERVICES

260 baby kits were distributed to ensure access to essential care.

100 individuals were reached through support to civil society and charitable organisations.



PROTECTION & SOCIAL COHESION

1,448 people were reached through awareness sessions and campaigns.

583 individuals were engaged in advocacy and awareness activities.

307 children (ages 3–5) were supported at the Smurf Centre in Zaatari to enhance psychological well-being.
