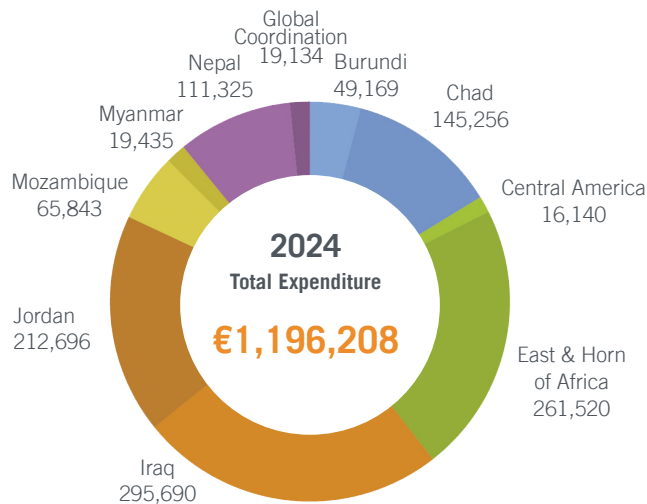
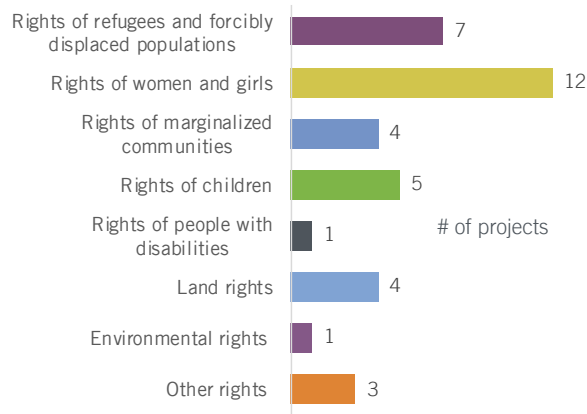

In Jordan, LWF enhances women’s economic rights through local business opportunities, training on labor laws, and advocacy.

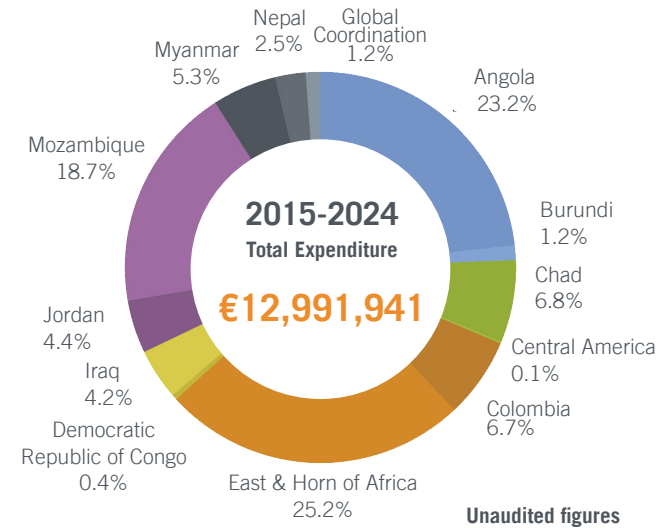
She aims to create a community that resists unfair employment practices and fights for the right to just working conditions.

KADANA [refugee platform] can be our voice to reach decision makers at the international level. It’s a dream of 25 years, something we have tried to do before but failed because we were alone.

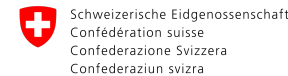
